## I. Welcome/Introductions

**II. Todd Harrison update: The year is off to a good start.** The sixth grade field trip to a rock climbing gym in Watertown was fun and bonding. III. **Creative Arts and Sciences update from Laura Davis**: Half of the PTO budget goes to CASC, which brings arts and science enrichment programs into school. The programs are tied closely to the curriculum. This year's highlights:

- Klezmer Conservatory Band (traditional music of eastern European Jews) for all grades
- Museum of Science's Motion, Speed, Velocity for 6th graders
- Writer Greg Mone on the process of nonfiction writing (he writes for Atlantic monthly, Scientific American, etc)
- Engineers Teaching Algebra (real life applications of algebra) for 7<sup>th</sup> graders
- Re-enactment of Boston Massacre (kids act as jury. Teaches lessons about American history and making assumptions) for 8<sup>th</sup> graders
